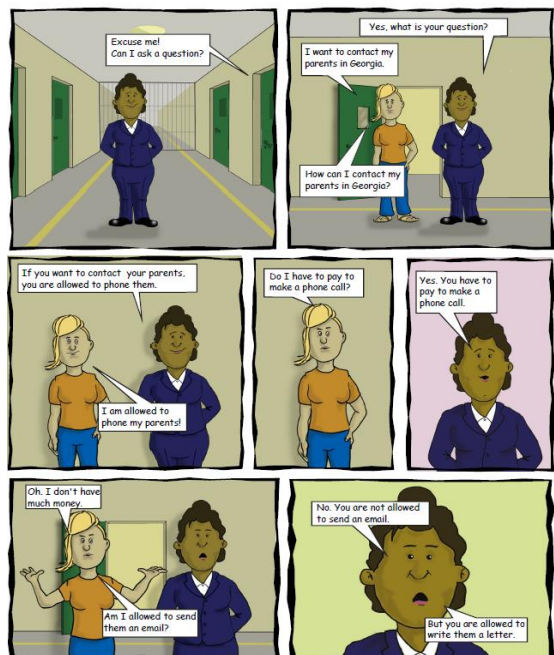


>>LBB: Languages Behind Bars

How do you try to deliver contextual, functional language to people who don't speak your language? Well, they say that a picture speaks a thousand words, and in LBB that is exactly what we are developing. Individual scenarios of prison communication will be presented in a series of attractive comic strips, which can be adapted to any language.



However, we also thought this was a great opportunity to go beyond the immediate LBB needs. With our artistic consultant Dave Wright (www.itsallwright.co.uk) we are producing a whole catalogue of prison characters, scenes and props that can be moved around to create almost any prison scenario. This is significant additional added value, since these artistic components can be used again and again in any number of prison educational resources.
